Structure, Governance & Management

The members of the Parochial Church Council are either ex officio or elected by the Annual Parochial Church Meeting (APCM) in accordance with the Church Representation Rules. People are elected for a term of office for three years, two years and one year in order to enable one third of the elected people to come off PCC each year and as a result only elect annually one third.

Committees

The PCC met six times during the year. The business discussed has been varied and very thought provoking. In addition the following committees/groups that meet as required to consider possible actions on specific issues.

Standing Committees

This is the only committee required by law. It has the power to transact the business of the PCC between its meetings, subject to any directions given by the Council.

Business Management Group

This group considers issues referred to it by Council (normally financial) and puts recommendations back to PCC for decision.

Health and Safety Officer

Risk Management

The PCC actively reviews the various risks and challenges associated with the church by means of its regular meetings. Measures to mitigate those risks are implemented accordingly.

Objectives & Activities

St John's Parochial Church Council (PCC) has the responsibility of co-operating with Rev. T McFadden, in promoting with the parish the whole mission of the Church, pastoral, social and evangelistic.

It also has responsibility for the oversight and the maintenance of the Church Centre complex at St John's and Emmanuel.

When planning our activities for the year, the Minister and the PCC have considered the Commission's guidance on public benefit and, in particular, the specific guidance on charities for the advancement of religion. In particular, we try to enable ordinary people to live out their faith as part of our parish community through:

Worship and prayer, learning about the Gospel; and developing their knowledge and trust in Jesus.

Provision of pastoral care for people living in the parish. Missionary and outreach work.

It has been a good year on the whole.

The PCC met six times and we have dealt with all the matters swiftly and grounded on Christian values and in prayer together.

One of the most challenging matters was to change one service a month to become more accessible to those outside the Christian faith.

This came at the same time thankfully when our highly gifted new music group came together. It has been work in progress with only three services completed by the end of 2014 although the feedback from the congregation has been overwhelming encouraging. Throughout the coming year our family services will be led by the group and we aim to make the service a place that non Christians can engage and be encouraged to meet with Christ.

Our new gifted group came into place, as we also discussed at the AGM in 2014 the idea of employing a church family worker. After a time of prayer, the PCC agreed to start discussing the idea and at the same time starting a church based mother and toddles meeting, with firm Christian values, through Christian teachings and Christian songs. As you now know the gift day for 2014 was dedicated for the church family worker's salary and the generosity and support for a new church based mother and toddles group and family worker was outstanding, outstripping gifts days of the past and the full amount of the person's salary was raised in a few weeks. This also showed the full support of the church for a fresh engagement with non Christians through a church family worker and new church based mother and toddles group...

At a next meeting we agreed to advertised for a Church family worker, and found a name for our group and by the end of 2014 everything was in place and the new church family worker interviewed and waiting to sign the contract.

The new group "Toddle-in" has gone from strength to strength, due to your support, prayer and the hard work of a dedicated PCC who have worked on your behalf completing God's work.

During 2014 has been a time of great investment, it was decided by your PCC, the overdue tired looking church centre was given a desperately new lease of life with an extensive decorating program that took over three weeks.

Now, we have a Church centre looking refreshed and a place where people appreciate the decision of the PCC to invest in our church centre that now brings money into our church funds after many years of taking from the church's income.

However, the PCC's investment never stopped there, we now turned to our church for more investment, with a new sound system to replace our outdated and unreliable old sound system. We also had much needed painting completed on the walls, pews and radiators. We also did some work again over due on the grounds and lastly with some more investment on church lighting we can say we have invested a great amount of money on our church centre and church, which has been over due and neglected in the past due to lack of funds and other needs making investment in the past impossible.

Our services are up in numbers and baptisms families are being retained in what the Church of England call regular attendance. While our Christmas and Easter services were also up on past years.

The Sunday school has shown encouragement and the PCC are grateful for the passion the Sunday school leaders have invested in all the children who attended the church in 2014.

The PCC also encouraged and supported our lay leaders and it's wonderful that we now have people who are clearly gifted and want to serve God, and gifted people who can lead and assist our services, a descion supported by your PCC once again on your behalf.

2014 was also a year we met eleven of the twelve parish shares, an incredible achievement considering we are in the top seven on nineteen churches in the St Helens deanery and our share each year is considerable higher than many churches locally.

On a more disappointing point, Liverpool diocese has now approached St John's on arrears dating back to 2010. A considerable amount from the past and it is disappointing that the diocese has waited to now to speak of these arrears.

However, it is where we are and we now have to engage with the diocese on these arrears and three others. What is also a matter of great concern is a matter of around £10,000 which is unaccounted for from somewhere in 2009 to the start of 2012. The feeling is by the diocese is this matter is in the past, although I have made the PCC aware that so are the Parish shares arrears.

Therefore it's understandable, that it would be unrealistic to want arrears from that period, yet not wanting to investigate fully the disappearance of such a large amount missing from the same period.

So, ongoing conversations are continuing between the PCC and the diocese.

In 2015 the Parish shares for all churches were increased again, and for those churches which are at the higher part of the league table which St John's is placed, like all churches we are finding it harder and harder each year to meet the increases expected parish share and this will become a problem for churches like St John's who are already paying more than most of the churches in the St Helens deanery.

It is the balanced and wise opinion of the PCC that the answer to the situation of the future of the Church of England cannot be solely laid upon the idea of an ever increasing parish share paid by the congregations each year. This is a matter facing every church, although clearly the PCC is looking to discuss with the Diocese the amount expected to be found each year by St John's and more so that where we are placed in the St Helens deanery league table.

Nevertheless, your PCC has dealt with all the matters in this report with honest and strong Christian's values, which have been held together in prayer and based on a Biblical foundation. While always seeking what is best for St John's and the wider Kingdom for God.

Once again I sit down to write this report as Warden a Warden. As you know, I have held this role for a number of years. I have been extremely busy working for the welfare of the Vicar, the Congregation and the Building itself. I would hope that the Congregation, as a whole, realise that if there is a problem they could always call on me.

I am responsible on behalf of the Bishop for the day to day running of the Church and as such have to liaise with many different Committee's involving Finance, Local Council, Police, Builders, Security, Insurance, Funerals, Weddings, Children Groups, Garden Maintenance, Cleaning, etc but to name a few.

For myself, our Vicar Terry and members of the PCC the past 12 months have been to say the least very difficult and stressful as we have been in constant conflict with issues mainly involving Finance between ourselves and certain members of the Liverpool Diocese at Church House. At the time of writing these issues have not been resolved.

This year, we have spent monies from our limited savings to repaint the Church Community Centre, Repaint the Church pews. We had a new Sound system set in place & new microphone for the Music group. Electrical work done inside the Church including the re-lighting behind the Holy Table and the usual, regular work of replacing slates on the Church roof and repairing Centre roof.

The Thatto Heath Crusaders Rugby Club is continuing to use the Conversion building. Thankfully the Conversion (formally known as Emmanuel) now has its full maintenance and all the utilities bills, including the insurance, paid by the Rugby Club.

During 2014 the Church used the Conversion building for our weekly coffee mornings.

Finally I would like to thank you all and especially to Terry, for your support during the past extremely hard 12 months. My wish is that St John's will continue to be THE LIGHT in this area for God's work to continue and people come to worship and know the RISEN LORD JESUS CHRIST.

Financial Review

Total receipts for ordinary unrestricted funds were £88,429. £87,808 was spent to provide Christian ministry of St Johns including £31,795 Diocesan Parish share

The net result for the year was a deficit on the year of £27,901 ~ £1,917 2013.

Investment Policy

The Council has considered the most appropriate policy for investing surplus funds and has found that charitable bonds meet their requirements to generate income. The council considers the return on investments at 1.5% in the year, to be satisfactory.

Reserves Policy

The Council have reviewed the Church's need for reserves in line with the guidance issued by the Charity Commission and have issued a detail reserves policy. The Council believe that in addition to known commitments there is a need to hold at least three months running costs in free reserves given that the Church's sources of funding are not certain and to ensure that the church can run efficiently and meet the needs of its parish.

At 31 December 2014 total reserves amounted to \pounds 344,924 of which \pounds 333,502 was held as restricted fixed assets and £13,446 was held as restricted funds. The PCC report a deficit for the year of £27,901.

Statement of Council's Responsibilities

The Church Accounting Regulations 2006 require the Council to prepare accounts for each financial year, which give a true and fair view of the state of affairs of the church, and of the results of the church for that period.

In preparing these financial statements we are required to:

select suitable accounting policies and apply them consistently make reasonable and prudent judgements and estimates state whether accounting standards have been followed and give details of any departures

prepare accounts on a going concern basis unless in our view the charity will be unable to continue in operation

We are also responsible for:

keeping proper accounting records safeguarding the charity's assets taking reasonable steps for the prevention and detection of fraud

1 Accounting Policies

a Basis of accounting

The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with the Church Accounting Regulations 2006 together with applicable accounting standards and the Charities SORP 2005.

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention except for the valuation of investment assets, which are shown at market value.

There has been no change to the accounting policies since last year No changes have been made to the accounts for previous years.

b Funds

Unrestricted fund reprepresent the funds of the PCC that are not subject to any restrictions regarding their use and are available for application on the general purposes of the PCC. Funds designated for a particular purpose by the PCC are also restricted. Restricted funds are funds that can only be used for a particular restricted purposes within the objects of the Church. Restrictions arise when specified by the donor or when funds are raised for particular restricted

The accounts include all transactions, assets and liabilities for which the PCC is responsible in law. They do not include the accounts of church groups that owe their main affiliation to another body or those that are informal gatherings of church members.

c Incoming Resources

Voluntary Income and Capital Sources

Collections are recognised when received by or on behalf of the PCC.

Planned giving receivable under Gift Aid is recognised only when received.

Income Tax recoverable on Gift Aid donations is recognised when the income is recognised. Grants and legacies to the PCC are accounted for as soon as the PCC is notified of its legal entitlement, the amount due is quantifiable and its ultimate receipt by the PCC is reasonably Sales of books and magazines from the church bookstall are accounted for gross.

Income from Investments

Interest entitlements are accounted for as the accrue. Tax recoverable on such income is recognised in the same accounting year.

Gains and Losses on Investments

Realised gains or losses are recognised when investments are sold. Unrealised gains or losses are accounted for on revaluation of investments at the year end.

d Resources Expended

Grants

Grants and donations are accounted for when paid over, or when awarded, if that award creates a binding obligation to the PCC.

Activities Directly Relating to the Work of the Church

The diocesan parish share is accounted for when paid. Any parish share unpaid at the year end is provided for in the accounts as an operational (though not a legal) liability and is shown as a creditor on the Balance Sheet.

Allocation of Costs

Costs are allocated between direct charitable and other expenditure according to the nature of the cost. Where items involve more than one category, they are apportioned between the categories according to the nature of the cost.

Expenditure and Liabilities

General liabilities are recognised as soon as there is a legal or constructive obligation committing the church to expenditure.

e Fixed Assets

Consecrated Property and Movable Church Furnishings

Consecrated and beneficed property of any kind is excluded from the accounts by Section 96(2) of the Charities Act 1993.

Movable church furnishings held by the Vicar and Churchwardens on special trust for the PCC, and which require a faculty for disposal, are accounted as inalienable property unless consecrated. They are listed in the church's Inventory which can be inspected (at any reasonable time). For inalienable property acquired prior to (2000) there is insufficient cost information available and therefore such assets are not valued in the accounts.

All expenditure incurred in the year on consecrated or beneficed buildings, individual items under £1,000 or on the repair of movable church furnishings acquired before 1 January 2000 is written

Buildings, Other Fixtures, Fittings and Office Equipment

Depreciation is calculated to write off the cost of fixed assets over their expected useful lives on the following bases:-
